



## Tips for Writing Your Personal Testimony

Writing your personal testimony is a powerful way to share how Christ has transformed your life. Here are some tips to help you structure and express your faith journey clearly and authentically:

- 1. Pray for Guidance**

- 6. Focus on God's Work in Your Life**  
Highlight God's role in your story, rather than focusing solely on your own actions. Describe how His grace, guidance, and love have been present along your journey.
- 7. Keep it Clear and Concise**  
Aim to be clear and to the point. A good testimony can often be shared in just a few minutes, so consider the main ideas you want people to remember.
- 8. Avoid Christian Jargon**  
Use language that anyone can understand, especially if your audience might not be familiar with Christian terminology. Aim for clarity so your story is accessible to everyone.
- 9. End with Encouragement or a Bible Verse**  
Wrap up your testimony with an encouraging thought, prayer, or favorite Bible verse. This can help others see the hope you've found and invite them to explore their own relationship with Christ.
- 10. Practice and Refine**  
Review your testimony a few times and, if possible, share it with a trusted friend for feedback. Practice helps you stay focused and confident in sharing your story with others.

Your testimony is a unique reflection of God's work in your life. By sharing it, you're giving others a glimpse of His love and power—don't underestimate its impact!



## **What if I don't have a "Strong" Testimony?**

If you feel like you don't have a "strong" testimony, it's important to understand that every testimony of coming to faith is powerful—regardless of how dramatic or simple it may seem. The strength of a testimony isn't in the circumstances, but in the way God transforms a life through His love and grace.

Here's some encouragement:

"Your story matters because it's about God's work in your life. Don't worry if it doesn't feel 'exciting' or if you didn't have a big turning point. Some people come to faith through a gradual, gentle journey, while others have a dramatic transformation—but both are beautiful because they show different aspects of how God draws people to Himself.

Instead of focusing on how your story compares to others, try thinking about what God has taught you over time. Maybe there were small, significant moments that drew you closer to Him, or seasons where He showed up in ways that deepened your faith.

Start with these questions: *What first made you feel drawn to God? How has He shown His faithfulness or changed you over time? How has your faith influenced your decisions, relationships, or outlook on life?*

Ultimately, your testimony is a way to reflect God's character and work in your life. He's given you a unique story that can encourage others—sometimes, a gentle, quiet journey of faith is just what someone else needs to hear."

I hope this has been encouraging to you and help you focus on God's presence in your life, no matter the circumstances, and to remember that any story that points to Jesus is a strong testimony!
